### FTTH Council announces new president

#### Fibre to the Home Council Europe


27 April 2007

27th April 2007 - Following the FTTH Council Europe's Annual General Assembly held in Brussels last week, members are pleased to announce Joeri Van Bogaert as newly elected President of the board. The Council is also calling upon the industry to meet an ambitious target of "a 10 fold increase of new connections over the next 3-5 years."

Joeri Van Bogaert, comments, " With FTTH deployment now recognised as 'the choice' for real broadband access within Europe, and as major implementations of the technology begin to approach, the Council has decided to shift to the next gear, in order to ensure that the decision makers across Europe choose FTTH as their access technology."

The FTTH environment has significantly changed since the FTTH Council's conception three years ago and influenced by the significant increase in the dynamics behind the European market, the Council has announced its organisational restructure. The new committee structure, agreed at the General Assembly is as follows:

- Deployment & Operation: Researching infrastructure and architecture issues within an

economical dimension. Including active and passive technology, energy consumption, environmental topics, rights of way and maintenance.

- Network and Service Revenues: Focusing on all topics surrounding end-user offerings such as services, contents, ARPU, end-user expectations, and customer-support.

- Market Intelligence: Expanding the existing market development focus to include economical and macro-economic information and private funding topics for investors and deployers.

- Public Policy & Regulation: Positioning Council proposals toward the European Commission, addressing policy makers to convince them that FTTH is necessary for a competitive Europe.

- Communications Committee: External and internal communications of the Council.

- Editorial Board: Overarching messaging, positioning and content development.

In addition there will be several ad-hoc working groups, such as the already established FTTH sustainable development group.

With few exceptions, Europe lags well behind the US and Asian tiger economies in the availability of high-speed broadband services (10 Mbps and upwards).
