New president elected to lead FTTH Council Europe

AMSTERDAM — The members of the FTTH Council Europe have voted in a new President and Board, having conducted elections today at its Annual General Assembly in Amsterdam. Karel Helsen is the new figurehead of the organisation, and replaces outgoing President Joeri Van Bogaert. Mr Van Bogaert stands down after serving as President for two successive years (the maximum number allowed), and before that as a Board member.

"As a Council and as an industry, we have ensured that FTTH is firmly installed at the heart of the debate around next generation broadband access in Europe. FTTH is part of the solution required to bring Europe out of recession," commented Karel Helsen. "As we approach the end of this decade, FTTH will not diminish its place as the choice for broadband investment, and as a key driver for economic stimulus, environmental sustainability and quality of life. I am honoured to take up this position and hope to see the activities of the Council extend even further in both scope and value."

The membership also passed several motions at the General Assembly, including the agreement to pursue a new strategy which broadens the target audience of the Council. Furthermore, the membership gave its support to the Council's plans to gradually expand its geographic remit to incorporate activities in the Middle East region. Together, these steps ensure that the benefits of FTTH are heard by more people than ever before in Europe and further afield.

"Our members are very confident and positive about the future; this is the feeling I get from the General Assembly, and from our latest annual conference which finished in Copenhagen just seven weeks ago," said Hartwig Tauber, Director General of the FTTH Council Europe. "The appeal of
