

FTTH Council Europe President meets with Luxembourg Prime Minister

BRUSSELS, 23 November 2015 - FTTH Council Europe President Edgar Aker met today with Luxembourg Prime Minister Xavier Bettel, patron of the FTTH Conference 2016, to discuss Luxembourg broadband strategy and fibre roll-out.

FTTH Council Europe President Edgar Aker met today in Luxembourg City with Xavier Bettel, Prime Minister and Minister for Communications and Media of the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg to exchange on the strategy and agenda of the *Digital Lëtzebuerg* initiative presented by the government in October 2014 and to discuss progress in the roll-out and adoption of fibre to the home (FTTH) in the country.

Edgar Aker also took this opportunity to thank the Prime Minister for his high patronage of the FTTH Conference 2016, to be held on 16-18 February in Luxembourg-City, Luxembourg. Xavier Bettel will deliver on 17 February the opening speech of the FTTH Conference, officially kicking off the largest FTTH-related event in the world.

More than 3,000 attendees including decision makers from the European Commission, national governments and municipalities, as well as management level attendees from telecom operators, financing institutions, service and application providers, analysts and industry experts, academia and media are expected to gather at the FTTH Conference.
